curiosity-building play, but there's always a purpose behind the fun. Starting just days after he was born, Jake embarked on a time of exploration




and learning that creates a vital "library" of experiences to build upon for the future. Jake loved everything about preschool and gathered valuable skills and

Il pups learn about the world around them through their senses, and Jake adored putting things in his mouth. From a very early age, he was taught what is acceptable to chew on and what is not. When this little guy tried to bite on shoelaces, pant legs, or fingers with his tiny, sharp, puppy teeth, he was redirected to a safe and satisfying chew toy instead. This type of consistent redirection and reinforcement helps to socialize Jake and the other pups so that when they head out to puppy raiser homes, they behave well and are not overly "mouthy" with their humans. Throughout his early



months, Jake became comfortable with human touch and handling, including gentle massage and petting. Engaging with people in Puppy Kindergarten is the best!

// Climbing to the Top

Part of the stimulating curriculum of Jake's Puppy Kindergarten involved trying out new surfaces and under footings. Jake enjoyed romping and climbing on a pint-sized playground of slides, tippy objects, exercise peanuts, and inclines, which improved his balance, strength, and endurance. While having fun, he gained confidence and became more sure-footed.
