t eight weeks old, puppies in training experience standardized assessments to observe their reactions to various stimuli-the humming sound of a vacuum cleaner; the surprise of a person wearing an unusual costume; a noisy windup toy bouncing away; and an umbrella opening in their path, for example. Kinsley demonstrated that she could remain relaxed and quickly recover when encountering new objects, motion, and noises. She could trot by an open umbrella, and a roly-poly fitness apparatus didn't faze her. She is so brave and smart!
