


Thanks for Sponsoring Kinsley

Joyce practice intentional body handling to help Kinsley get accustomed to regular human touch. They often enjoy a night walk followed by Kinsley's bedtime at 10:00 p.m.

Art and Joyce can almost see the wheels turning in Kinsley's brain as she works on her basic skills, including

sit, down, and stay. When she practices standing on a paw pad, she learns self-control and models good body alignment for the heel position.

Learning the Ropes

ocialization is essential for puppies in training, and Kinsley loves walking and visiting around Art and Joyce's community. This good-natured pup practices leash manners at an indoor track and enjoys watching people there. Her raisers emphasize positive reinforcement, rewarding her with treats and a "yes!" when she keeps her leash loose without pulling. She comes when called, knows to *switch* to the other side of her handler for proper etiquette with left-opening doors, and tucks



her body down between her handler's legs for the *close* cue to avoid being a tripping hazard in restaurants. Kinsley does her best!

"B" is for Bravo!

Kinsley practices self-control with Joyce by playing a game at mealtimes. Called the "B-game," Kinsley sits away from her bowl while Joyce speaks multiple words that start with B: bratwurst, bravo, and bacon, for example. Kinsley remains quiet in a perfect sit position until she hears the magic word—break—then runs to her bowl to eat. This pup has fun while mastering the skills of patience, impulse control, and good listening!

Art and Joyce report that she is a
"comfortable, sassy, and hilarious"
