After seven years with the Naval Military Police, Jessica Rhein re entered a world where protecting others was all she knew. Lost. The physical and emotional pain, unbearable.

"I didn't know how to communicate effectively, so I just kept it all in," Jessica says. "I had major PTSD, so I kept myself from others."

But when intelligent Spencer came along, he simply wouldn't allow his person to hold back any longer. When Jessica traps her emotions inside, Spencer's loving gaze gently tells her, "No, we're feeling this. Together."

Spencer welcomes Jessica into a new life where his perfectly timed hugs help her decompress from stressful situations and his playful energy and purposeful nose nudges remind her to prioritize herself. And he won't stop nudging until she does.

"There's a complete awareness that I didn't know I was lacking and neglecting about myself," she admits.

Spencer brings relief, joy, and rescue to Jessica in ways she never even knew she needed. Until she met him.
